About this hearing

This was the sixth and final hearing of the House Judiciary Antitrust Subcommittee's bipartisan investigation into competition in digital markets, launched in June 2019. It was the first time the chief executives of Amazon, Apple, Facebook, and Google testified together before Congress. According to the Subcommittee Chair's opening statement, the investigation had by then gathered millions of pages of evidence from the four firms, submissions from more than 100 market participants, hundreds of hours of interviews, five prior hearings, and 17 briefings and roundtables. The Subcommittee's majority staff report, *Investigation of Competition in Digital Markets*, followed in October 2020.
